
brothers and sisters in Christ to help grow our next generation of Japanese Christian leaders.

For most of 2017, we took a temporary hiatus from youth ministry to strategize and train leadership for an eventual relaunch in 2018. The renewed youth ministry happened just a few months ago. Equipped with fresh and excited leaders, and a slightly new model, JGCT's youth group has officially relaunched.

We have widened the age group of our youth ministry to grade 7 and up. Many of our high school stu-

dents have gone off to college and university, and our junior high age group is large and lively. Our youth ministry has a focus on partnering with the youth and their families to develop vibrant faith and joy in serving their communities.

The teens have enjoyed cooking together so they are able to learn basic knife skills, familiarize themselves with different cookware, and master simple recipes. Not only is it fun to cook together, we can develop creativity and competency in the kitchen so that they can help out with meals in their own home. Most of our

youth and their families have deep connection to the church. Because of this, one of our key strategies is partnering with the parents to help develop their teens' faith.

This past Easter, the youth group ran our children's Easter program. The youth planned the Bible

> story, game, and craft that were prepared for the children. At this point in their lives, it's so valu-

able to give teens opportunities to serve in meaningful ways within the church. This also gives opportunity for the young children to have good interaction with those who are older than them. Hopefully, by having mixed age programming, children will be able to learn from each other and be open minded with different people.

We are very excited about God working in our youth. This past Easter one of our youth was baptized as well. Praise God because He calls young people to faith in Him! We are very encouraged by this young man and are looking forward to seeing how God continues to transform him in the future.
